The Alice Springs Town Council tried two weeks ago to pass a motion supporting the retention of Pine Gap and encouraging the preparation of a 'special disaster plan' for the Alice Springs region.

Alderman Michelle Castagna objected to the lack of consultation with YOU, the people of Alice Springs, and the matter was deferred. You now have a little over a week to register an opinion on this vital issue.

The Alice Springs Peace Group, as you already know, opposes the retention of Pine Gap - but we do support the Council's attempt to encourage preparation of a disaster plan. We do not believe the Council has given the Community enough time to think this issue through.

NOTICE TO YOU?


Because we are citizens of this town who are genuinely concerned.
